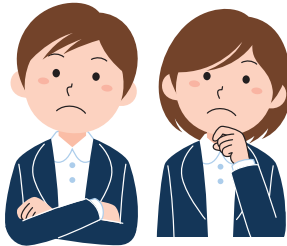
Japan and world expos (international expos)

How are Japan and expos connected?

International expos attract the attention of people all across the world. To date, five expos have been held in Japan. The technologies and ideas presented at each represent the image of the future as imagined by the people of the time.



How are exhibitions and expos different?

An exhibition is an event that showcases a collection of various new technologies, arts, and culture, helping people think of the future.



World + exhibition = Expo
(“World” here means many countries)

Expos are international exhibitions where people from many countries participate, and they attract the attention of the whole world. Let's take a look at how Japan is connected with expos!



● First time participating in an expo

The first world expo that the Japanese government participated in was the Vienna World's Fair in Austria. A variety of things from Japan were brought to the event to show the world the best of Japan.



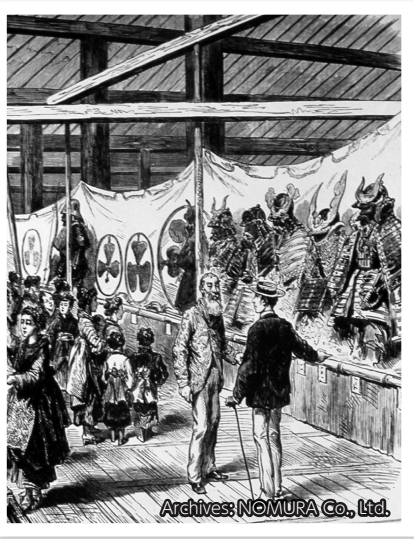

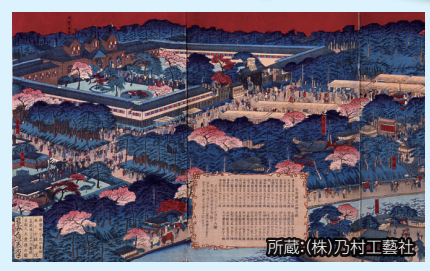
Thanks to participating in the Vienna World's Fair, expos were held in Japan one after the other. Let's take a look at these expos.



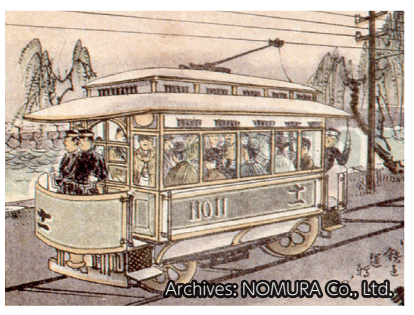
1877 First National Industrial Exhibition

The first 3 were in **Tokyo**

Toshimichi Okubo helped promote this expo as he was active in the Meiji government who wanted to modernize Japan. It was a venue where the technologies of Europe, America, and Japan could meet.



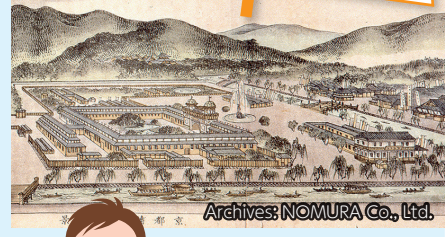

1895 Fourth National Industrial Exhibition

Expos go to Kansai! **Kyoto**

This was the first place in Japan to have a streetcar, which carried many visitors to the expo. This even also resulted in the development of roads and Japanese inns, forming the foundation of Kyoto as a sightseeing city.



There were also places where people could view aquatic creatures from the side, or in other words, what we call an aquarium today.

Osaka 1903 Fifth National Industrial Exhibition

Various items from countries around the world were displayed in the reference museum built with future expos in mind, and a record-breaking number of people visited.

The theme of this expo was the ocean. The artificial island of Aquapolis garnered attention as a model for future marine cities. It was redeveloped into what is now the Ocean Expo Park, where the Okinawa Churaumi Aquarium is located.

We need to solve the problem of poverty if we want everyone's life to be brilliant around the world. Poverty creates many problems such as hunger and malnutrition because people don't have enough to eat, and lack of access to education.

To ensure that all people live long, healthy lives, they need access to medical care to treat diseases and injuries. Care is particularly important for babies and children.

Safe water and a sanitary environment are also necessary.



End poverty in all its forms everywhere

There are many people around the world without enough food or safe drinking water. Not only are they poor because they lack money, but also because they lack what is important.

Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls.

In some countries, girls are not allowed to attend school and they are married at a very young age. Japan is known as one of the worst countries in the world for gender equality.

Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all.

Some children around the world lose their lives because they don't have safe water to drink. Because they don't have running water, some children must go far from home to collect it, and they don't have time for school.

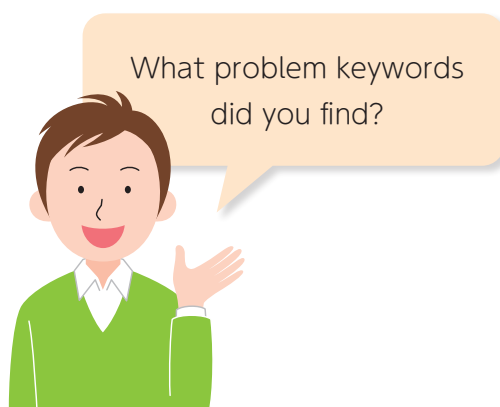
